Anti-Bullying Policy

Statement of Intent

We are committed to providing a caring, friendly and safe environment for all our members so they can participate in rhythmic gymnastics in a relaxed and secure atmosphere. Bullying of any kind is unacceptable at our club. If bullying does occur, all our club members or parents should be able to tell and know that incidents will be dealt with promptly and effectively. We are a TELLING club. This means that anyone who knows that bullying is happening is expected to tell the Club Welfare Officer or any committee member.

What is Bullying?

Bullying is the use of aggression with the intention of hurting another person. Bullying results in pain and distress to the victim.

Bullying can be:

- Emotional being unfriendly, excluding (emotionally and physically) sending hurtful text messages, tormenting, (e.g. hiding equipment, threatening gestures)
- Physical pushing, kicking, hitting, punching or any use of violence
- Racist racial taunts, graffiti, gestures
- Sexual unwanted physical contact or sexually abusive comments
- Homophobic because of, or focusing on the issue of sexuality
- Verbal name-calling, sarcasm, spreading rumours, teasing.

Why is it important to respond to bullying?

Bullying hurts. No one deserves to be a victim of bullying. Everybody has the right to be treated with respect. Individuals who are bullying need to learn different ways of behaving. The impact upon a child or young person can be devastating and in some cases affect all aspects of their life, in extreme circumstances it can lead to suicide threats or even attempts.

This club has a responsibility to respond promptly and effectively to issues of bullying.

Objectives of this policy

All club members, coaches, officials and parents/carers should have an understanding of what bullying is

- All club members, officials and coaching staff should know what the club policy is on bullying, and follow it when bullying is reported
- All gymnasts and parents/carers should know what the club policy is on bullying, and what they should do if bullying arises
- As a club we take bullying seriously. Gymnasts and parents/carers should be assured that they would be supported when bullying is reported
- BULLYING WILL NOT BE TOLERATED!
